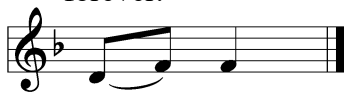

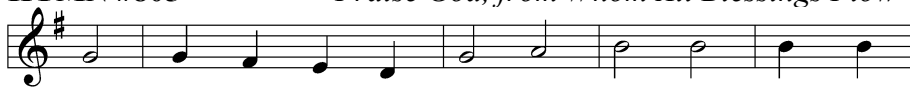

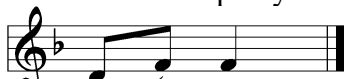
PRAYER OF THE CHURCH
