## <sup>1</sup>Karonga CLCMS Church Community Now Has Safe Water! (Sharing safe drinking water & Christ, the “Living Water” in Malawi)

Members of Alexandria LCMS Circuit (and many other friends) have anxiously looked forward to the day that this church could have safe water:

- Sent Water Filters for Karonga Confessional Lutheran Church Malawi Synod households in 2023. Babies, small children, and elderly were especially susceptible to contaminated drinking water supplies.

## ERC Renovation begins Fall 2024!

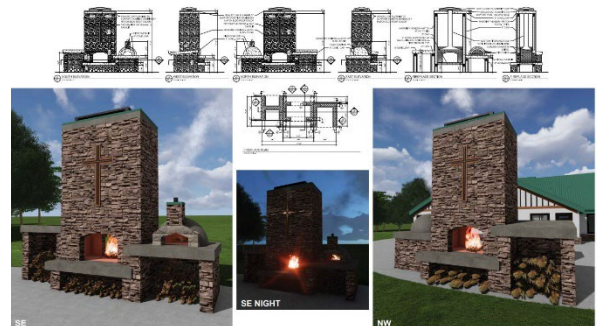
We are excited for the start of the ERC renovation in the fall of this year! As of right now, we have raised \$1.9 million toward the reinvention of the Education & Retreat Center.

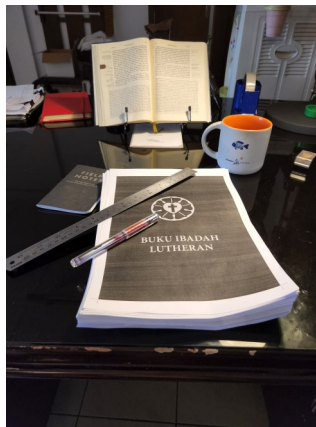

## BUKU IBADAH LUTHER (BIL)

AKA THE INDONESIAN HYMNAL

Long time readers and supporters of this ministry in Indonesia will be familiar with our work on the Indonesian hymnal. Work started on it over ten years ago. That's a long time, but a hymnal and service book is not something to rush. Taking our time to reflect, revisit, revise, and expand the BIL has indeed resulted in delays, but I believe this extra time and work will be worth it when the BIL gets published.

### BIL Files Sent to Layout and Design!

A major milestone has been reached as the BIL moves toward publication. BIL files have been sent to our layout and design specialist, Steve Blakey. Mr. Blakey has worked with the LCMS and Lutheran Heritage Foundation on several hymnal projects in the past. He has a great understanding of the particular needs a project like this presents as well as the technical skill to bring a professional and artistic aesthetic to the BIL.

There will no doubt be more work to do as Mr. Blakey reviews the files and asks clarifying questions. The bulk of our work is done, but the to do list will continue to fill out as we seek contracts with printers and publishers.

We are planning to print two editions, an economic edition which parallels the quality of other hymnals

available in the Indonesian language and a deluxe edition which mirrors the quality of current service books available in the United States. In total we plan to make 3,000 copies for the first printing.

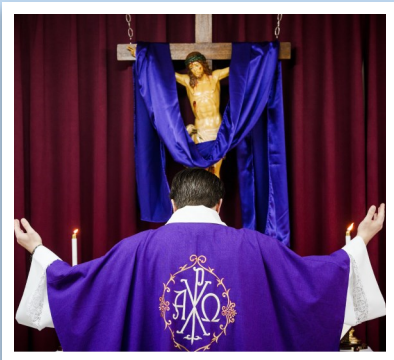
### BIL Dedication in November and LCMS Church Relations Visit.

In November the GKLI will host a pastors' conference in Dolok Sanggul, which coincides with a visit from LCMS Church Relations and Deaconess Sandra Rhein. Everyone intown at the same time presents the perfect opportunity to dedicate the new hymnal.

A visit from LCMS Church relations also means that Altar and Pulpit Fellowship dialogue between the GKLI and the LCMS continues to bear fruit. This meeting in November is an opportunity for the LCMS to see the GKLI in action both at a pastors' conference and in Sunday morning worship. The next step toward Church fellowship would be a visit to the LCMS headquarters in Saint Louis.

Please pray that the hymnal continues to progress toward publication and that it will be ready for the November meeting. Also pray for Church Fellowship dialogue between the LCMS and the GKLI. Hopefully, the Synod can recognize fellowship at the 2026 convention.

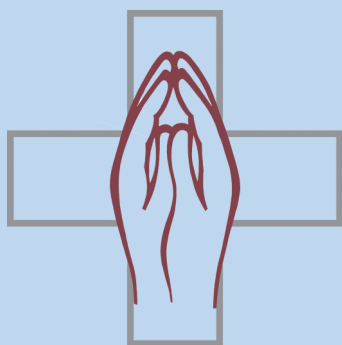

## Aviation Orientation

In March through June, Jonathan was busy with pre-field orientation. This is advanced aviation training given to new recruits headed to the mission field. We had 10 new recruits – 6 pilots and 4 mechanics. Jonathan's focus was on training 3 of the pilots in a Cessna 206. The training culminated with 10 days in the North Carolina mountains to learn mountain flying techniques including landing on short, sloped mountain runways. These 10 men did great and they and their families are ready to serve on the mission field.

## Oshkosh AirVenture

This year again, Jonathan is part of the team representing JAARS at the EAA AirVenture Airshow in Oshkosh, WI from July 22 – July 28. Nathan and Rachel will also be part of the team. This is the biggest airshow in the USA and JAARS uses the opportunity to promote missionary aviation and to recruit pilots and mechanics.

## Carrie's Role with JAARS

In our last newsletter we told you about Carrie's new role as the administrative assistant for the JAARS aviation training manager. She kept very busy logging and filing the daily training records from pre-field orientation. Her biggest project lately has been preparing for a new apprenticeship program that JAARS is starting in September. This new program will be used to train and mentor new pilots and mechanics who don't meet the normal experience requirements that JAARS has for field service.
