 Sent Water Filters for Karonga Confessional Lutheran Church Malawi Synod households in 2023.
 Babies, small children, and elderly were especially susceptible to contaminated drinking water supplies.





Aviation Orientation

In March through June, Jonathan was busy with pre-field orientation. This is advanced aviation training given to new recruits headed to the mission field. We had 10 new recruits – 6 pilots and 4 mechanics. Jonathan's focus was on training 3 of the pilots in a Cessna 206. The training culminated with 10 days in the North Carolina mountains to learn mountain flying techniques including landing on short, sloped mountain runways. These 10 men did great and they and their families are ready to serve on the mission field.


