






NICENE CREED






PRAYER OF THE CHURCH





Who can I tell about how Jesus is the prophesied righteous Branch?

<u>110 years ago on Nov. 29, 1914</u> this church building was dedicated as the 1^{st} building owned by Immanuel. For 11 years prior to that we worshipped in homes and then rented the Methodist Church in the afternoon.

<u>The first Sunday</u> of every month is **LWML Mite Sunday**. We invite you to drop your loose change into the LWML mite box in the narthex. 25% of our mites go to the national biennial goal of \$2,350,000, including \$100,000 for Set Apart to Serve. The remainder of our mites are sent to the Minnesota North District for grants of \$147,000 biennially, including \$15,000 for Dakota Boys and Girls Ranch. There is also a box for Canadian coins and other donations for Michael Thomas.
